OVERVIEW

The Hope Ignites Residential Program is a selective scholarship program for young men and women of high character and capability. Since our beginnings in 1986, our hallmark program provides safe, nurturing, family-like homes for up to 18 Scholars on our 5.5-acre Campus of Hope located in Garfield Heights. Our "home-away-from-home" environment, coupled with an outstanding education and a unique partnership with each Scholar's family, provides the support needed for all Scholars to achieve their full potential. Residential Scholars also participate in our out-of-school time Academy Program on a weekly basis.

Admission Process



NOMINATION

A potential Scholar's family can self-nominate or a student can be nominated by his or her school or a community organization. The family is then asked to complete an inquiry packet, and we collect academic records. Begin the process today at: bhgh.me/residential!



CAMPUS TOUR

After an inquiry packet is completed, we contact the family to share more about the program and answer questions. A campus tour will be scheduled for the student and family so that they are able to see our campus and learn more about the admission process.



APPLY

At this point, the family decides if they would like to formally apply to the program. This includes:

- **1. Initial Application:** Family will complete an initial application over the phone with a team member to collect basic information.
- **2. Applicant "Shadow" Day:** Applicant is invited to come after school to participate in residential life for an evening and complete an interview.
- 3. Student Application: Applicant is asked to complete an application which includes a formal essay and submitting letters of recommendation.
- **4. Family Interview and Proof of Income:** An official meeting is scheduled to review family goals and hopes for their child. Family submits proof of income.



CANDIDATE WEEK

An applicant is invited to spend 3-5 nights on campus to fully experience the program and complete additional individual and group activities.



PRE-ADMISSION

If accepted, a candidate is offered a place in our Residential Program! Together with a team member, the family will complete pre-admission steps and paperwork.



ADMISSION

The student moves on campus and becomes an official member of our Residential Program!
